Discussion: Piraeus Port Authority (PPA) challenges

- 2 tugboats required for Pure Car and Truck Carriers (PCTC) when entering the Port of Piraeus
- lower priority is given to Pure Car and Truck Carriers (PCTC) calling the Port of Piraeus
- stevedores refuse to lash/secure this cargo on the service Mafis, even though PPA invoices loading/discharging costs
- Heavy Ro-Ro: shortage of qualified drivers from PPA's side
- tariff increase: Tariff adjustment only applicable to cars in import / export but not to transhipment volumes
- mooring / unmooring fees increased by PPA by 100% as from 1st January 2019

Discussion: Challenges in other ports

- The Legal Spanish Regulations obliges in the process of loading and unloading trains, the using of a "safety rail" of 90 centimeters (from the base of the upper platform)
- Some of the biggest UIC users of the installations of the Port of Barcelona, do not reach this 90 centimeters, but only 40 centimeters or 60
- SETRAM would like to include this point during the meeting, as the experience of the rest of the group would be very interesting for the users of the Port of Barcelona, as the Port of Barcelona provides the only installation for UIC trains in Spain (for vehicles)

European Green Deal


- It will make the 2050 carbon neutral target legally binding, including a 90% reduction in emissions for transport
- This requires a review of current legislation and policies
- Funding opportunities will come at both the EU and national level





Transport & Logistics

- 72% of transport emissions comes from road (emphasis on shifting to rail and water)
- For freight, the Commission has set out a path that is almost certain to lead to **higher costs** in areas of trucking, aviation and shipping, whether in usage charges, carbon trading or new fuel requirements.
- But it also points to more investment in innovation and new technology, (e.g. trucking electrification and charging infrastructure)







Budget

Over a period of 7 years, the Commission has envisaged a budget of €1.074 trillion which adds to the €750 billion Next Generation EU rescue package in the wake of the coronavirus crisis



Capacity.

The Capacity Working Group (CWG) was formed to address loss of efficiency due to forecasting quality in the industry. Project Caesar was created to address this and concluded in 2019 with the publication of ECG Standard for vehicle logistics forecasting as a recommended methodology for a forecasting cycle which assists with more accurate forecasting and provides guidelines on how to improve the accuracy of the process in the long term. ECG now promotes this standard and encourages its members to promote it towards their customers.

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
