Capacity

One of ECG's strategic objectives for 2023 is the revision of its <u>FVL forecasting methodology</u> (Project Caesar for those who remember the original project name). Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the semiconductor crisis and other material shortages, the visibility in vehicle production and therefore the quality of forecasts OEMs provide to our members have been heavily affected. We plan to rework and update the existing methodology to suit better the needs of the industry in times of uncertainty. The revision process will soon start and initially take the form of interviews with OEMs and LSPs alike by our partner organisation, ICDP. The revised document will be ready by May and presented at the <u>General Assembly</u>.

Digitalisation

The ECG-Odette joint standard for the <u>VIN label in the supply chain</u> was published in December. It is built on ECG's own document from 2019, which already established the best position for the labels on the left rear window, independently from the drive direction. The new document proposes a QR code to be present on the label instead of the one dimensional barcodes, as the QR codes can contain more information and are generally more robust.

Besides this, the novelty on the VIN label is a three letter code making reference to the powertrain of the vehicle. By this the Alternative Fuel Vehicles can be easily labelled and visually identified which is a major challenge especially in the maritime industry. Such a visual <u>identification of the vehicles</u> has been asked for by ECG's members some years ago and this was also included in EMSA's relative <u>guidance document</u> issued in the Spring.

The Digitalisation group's current open initiative is a discussion group on Telematics. The group is still in its first, inventory phase and will soon decide on next steps.

The main theme on the agenda was definitely around the maritime transport of Alternative Fuel Vehicles, which generated a lively debate and will for sure be a discussion point for the next meetings too as more scientific evidence will come out later this year. This might also lead to the revision of the <u>EMSA guidance document</u> on this issue.

Besides this the group discussed about the growing number of vehicles transported by containers and the many operational questions around this. A dedicated sub-group was created with the interested parties, from OEMs, shipping lines, compound operators as well as inspection companies, and it will soon be convened. Another separate group was also initiated on the transport of used cars, which is an important activity of ECG members besides the transport of finished vehicles and which might need some minimum standards to be specified.
