# **Capacity**

No further updates since last month's WG Updates edition.

#### **Digitalisation**

The ECG Tech Board was initiated earlier this year to act as a 'steering committee' for the DWG as it will largely contribute to the topics that the working group should be dealing with. Its 15-20 selected members come from LSPs, OEMs and, of course, IT companies, partners of ECG.

The DWG's Telematics sub-group finished its work in June, but some further topics were initiated to be looked at in smaller reflection groups. These are the deviation from the ETA and its reporting in truck transport and the consideration of a Port Control Tower in the maritime environment. These are currently on-going activities which should yield some tangible results in the next months. The other suggestion from the meeting was to look into how the rail transport can be more 'connected', how to track the wagons and, if possible, the transported vehicles. ECG has been looking into these questions as well and will be reporting on it in a suitable format in due course.

Besides this the updates are ongoing on the <u>FVL digital messages</u> as well – a standard that ECG-Odette-VDA issued in 2020 and which is being taken up not only by BMW and VW, the companies most advanced in their implementation, but also by Mercedes, Renault, Stellantis and Volvo Cars. Version 1.2 of the messages will be published in the beginning of October and VW will present on its implementation status at the <u>Odette Conference</u> in Berlin, on 20-21 November.

# EU Affairs

1. Harmonisation of loaded length of car transporters at EU level

In July the European Commission published the Greening Freight package including the proposal to revise the Weights & Dimensions Directive. ECG welcomes the proposal and especially the introduction of Article 8c to harmonise loaded length of vehicle transporters at EU level up to a total of 20.75m. As the Council and European Parliament are entering negotiations on the file, ECG continues with its advocacy to have vehicle transporters recognised in EU legislation allowing them to cross borders with overhangs. ECG has produced a position paper with a proposal to amend Article 8c to better reflect operational reality in our sector. The position paper can be found <u>here</u>.

2. New CO<sub>2</sub> road tax in Germany

3. Smart tachographs

Smart tachograph version 2 (SMT2) is the new generation of on-board digital recorder to enforce the EU legislation on professional drivers driving and resting times, cabotage and posting of drivers rules. From 21 August 2023, newly registered commercial vehicles must be equipped with the SMT2. Some Member States have granted tolerance periods because of shortage of devices.
