# **Capacity**

# Health & Safety

The annual incident report for 2023 is now published and the main findings were presented during the webinar. The webinar included an introduction to the Health & Safety Working Group, an explanation of the incident reporting activity and a summary of high risk incidents for 2023.

The report contains an overview of the most common incidents that are happening during loading/unloading operations on car transporters, a breakdown of high risk incidents (Slips&Trips, Roll-offs, Falls from height, Drive-offs, Collisions, Transport incidents and delivery at retailers) and key recommendations for the industry.
