## Quality

To strengthen safety measures in the maritime handling of Battery Electric Vehicles, ECG has released a <u>new manual</u> compiling good practices from across the industry. The publication is the result of collaboration among shipping lines to exchange expertise and establish practical recommendations for BEV operations on board vessels. An article was also published in <u>ECG News</u> which members of the group also contributed to.

ECG also <u>published an article</u> on the ECG-Odette VIN-label standard. In this article, Volvo Cars is demonstrating the benefits of the standardised VIN-label, which simplifies and streamlines the Finished Vehicle Logistics process. The standard label supports consistent positioning and information sharing across OEMs, ports, and compound operators — ensuring smoother operations, fewer errors and faster vehicle handling. Further refinements are planned for 2026 with the original working group.

The next Quality meeting will be held on 20-21 January in Antwerp, Belgium, hosted by Antwerp Euroterminal. More information will come soon and the registrations will also be launched in the course of November.

#### Rail

In the past months, the Rail Initiative's efforts have been focussed on the creation of a "Rail catalog" and also on the cooperation with Infront Consulting to prepare the update of the Expert study on the state of FVL by Rail. Both documents will be published soon. We will reach out to our members in November-December to plan further activities of the group.

#### **Sustainability**

The Emissions calculation and reporting guideline v2 will be published in November. The updated version will include results from 6 pilot projects that tested the calculation method and the data structure. Additional information will be available on insetting, hubs and compounds.

Another initiative of the Sustainability Working Group are the Sustainability Days, scheduled for 4–5 February in Wörth, Germany. The program focuses on decarbonization in practice, tackling the main challenges faced by the industry in adopting sustainable transport solutions and reducing environmental impact across daily operations.

Over two days, participants will explore how to measure, report and reduce emissions across every transport mode and logistics operation. The event will feature expert presentations, real-world case studies, and collaborative workshops designed to turn strategy into action.
